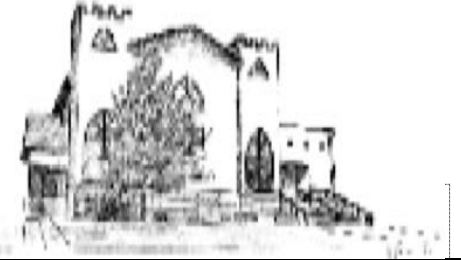

### Birthright Israel Trip – January 2-23 – Josh & Adam Makarov

On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, my younger brother Adam and I boarded the plane to Montreal to join a cohort of young Jewish adults traveling with Birthright Israel on an unforgettable 10-day trip to our holy land. Flying into Tel Aviv, my expectations of a heavily guarded airport were replaced by a warm welcome and a stray cat on the baggage carousel. Our group was making small talk and eyeing the nearest coffee machine while the staff organized us on the bus. Moments later, we were headed north.

Our first stop was the Bahai Gardens of Haifa. We got out to marvel at the view of the port and the nineteen terraces descending in perfect symmetry. Next, the hotel in Tiberius. After almost two days of travel, we were finally headed for a shower. That night, we ate a delicious meal together and in pure Birthright fashion, went to bed exhausted.

Day 3: early wakeup. The bus loaded up and we made our way to Tzfat, the city of mysticism. Our tour guide Kutzi (pronounced Cutie), explained how the city, unlike others, was built around the center. As we walked towards the Ari Ashkenazi Synagogue,

Kuti stopped us at an alley way and told us of a woman who would sit there every day waiting for the Messiah! Afterwards, we stopped at the Amiad Winery in one of the many Kibbutzim and tasted pomegranate wine. This was also the first time we spotted a kosher McDonalds which, by the way, proved to be disappointing. After lunch, we went to the Hula Nature Reserve nearby for a 10k bike ride around the park. Here in the Hula valley, Israel welcomes over 500 million birds as they migrate from Europe to Africa. To wrap up the day, we had supper on our own and went to bed.

Our next destination was Tel Aviv. On the way down we were invited to listen to the story of an Ethiopian woman who walked more than a month alongside her brother and aunt to Sudan for a chance to live in Jerusalem. Hearing her speak left a lasting impression on many of us. In Tel Aviv, we were allotted some leisure time to explore the nearby area and eat lunch. Later that night, we celebrated Shabbat as a group. The next day, Saturday, we enjoyed the day of rest with discussions on Jewish identity and a reflection on the past week. The madrichim (leaders) gave us some Jewish themes on paper and asked us to rank them in terms of what we felt was held the most meaning to us as Jews. Frankly, it was quite amazing to see the difference in opinions when it came to our shared religion. Personally, I was convinced that the belief in God would be unanimously at the top of the list.

The next day, we went to the Bedouin tents in the desert to get up close and personal with camels and donkeys. What followed was a bonfire and a restless sleep in a tent. Deserts get cold at night, who would have thought. Early wakeup. Trek to the peak of Masada via the old Roman path. Rain and cold wind. Ruins of the synagogue and bathhouses. Immersive panoramic view with the Dead Sea an arm's reach away. Lunch by the Sea and a delicious introduction to Turkish salad: tomato sauce and onions. The weather was back to sunshine, and we all floated until our skin shone.

The final leg of our trip was Jerusalem. The Holy City. Our first day there we visited Mount Herzl and Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Remembrance Center. The day was moving and emotional as we were led from exhibit to exhibit, and witnessed some of the bitterest pages of our history. The following day we drove to the Western Wall. Mesmerizing, sacred, and the symbol of our resilience. We wore tefillin, said the Shema, and observed the site in awe. To wrap up the final day, we were dropped off at the Mahane

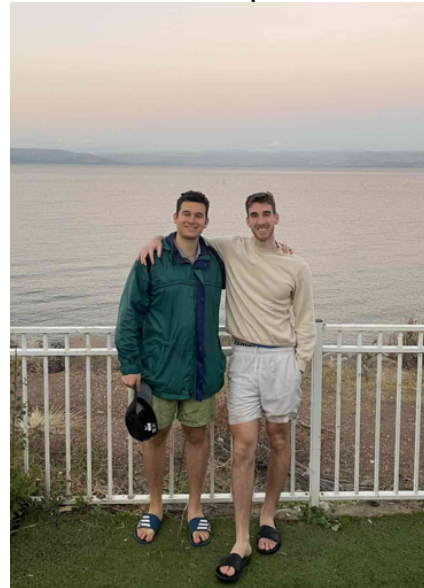
Yehuda market, the biggest market in Israel. What an incredible symphony of colors, smells and flavors!

On a personal note, we were extremely happy to see our paternal grandmother who lives in Jerusalem and whom we hadn't seen for a few years since her last visit to Moncton.

Our journey was concluded. From the silent mysticism of Tzefat to the rolling hills of Jerusalem, we were exposed to the wonders of Israel and its people. We are left inspired and more connected than ever with our heritage and religion. For those of you who are eligible and wondering: yes, sign up and go on the trip! There is no better time than now to experience Israel.

I/We, the undersigned below hereby appoint Rabbi Yitzchok I Yagod to act as my/our agent to sell my/our chametz and any admixture of chametz and any derivative thereof, and food forbidden by the laws of chametz on Pesach and any particles of chametz and flavors of chametz even those that are found in cooking utensils, all of these:

I/we appoint and give full authority to Rabbi Yitzchok I Yagod to sell to any non-Jew he chooses or to any agent he designates even up to 100 agents and does whatever is needed sell the aforementioned chametz in accordance with Halachah.

BY filling in my name below: Rabbi Yitzchok I Yagod is appointed as my/our agent to have full legal and halachic authority and discretion to act and ensure that the sale of this chametz is to be done with all the halachic requirements to ensure that the sale is valid under the laws of the Torah and as well valid under the relevant local laws of the government of the domiciles of the undersigned and of the location of the chametz.

The chametz will be sold on Erev Pesach 5783 and will fully belong to the non-Jew over the entire period of Pesach and including the day before Pesach until **3.5** hours after Pesach ends, whereupon the non-Jewish owner of the chametz can decide to terminate the sale and forfeit the deposit paid thus practically returning the Chametz to where it came from.
