

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Congregant,

Rosh Hashanah is fast approaching and I'm happy to bring you greetings and good wishes from the Board of Directors.

In many ways it has been a very difficult year: the president resigned soon after being re-elected, the treasurer resigned not long after being selected by the Board, a number of long-time members have passed away, our finances have become more tenuous, rabbi Yagod and the Reb-betzin have been away from the community for long periods of time and our synagogue was closed down for months because of Covid.

However, good things have happened, too: our synagogue is open again, Saturday minyans have been fairly well attended, a

number of new members have joined the synagogue, Pinchas has been here to assist with Services, we have revised the dues structure and are confident that our finances will be back in good order soon, we are preparing a Duty Roster which will make sure we have minyans on Friday evening and Saturday morning, we have a new Treasurer who is quite competent and very enthusiastic and we conducted a survey of both members and non-members to find out what is wanted, in terms of programs and services (a Committee is working at implementing some of the doable suggestions). So, we look forward to the New Year with enthusiasm and optimism.

One thing we badly need is much more community involvement. Whether it's attending Services, at least occasionally, or attending adult education classes, or coming to the synagogue to enjoy speakers or entertainers, we want to see you in the synagogue, to show your interest and to enjoy what's available. It's very frustrating for those who work hard to arrange minyans (for a Yahrzeit, for example), or plan an event, to see a severe lack of

interest. If you want your synagogue to be here 5 years from now, then get involved, don't always expect others to keep the ball rolling. Anything ignored long enough will, sadly, eventually cease to exist. I know that every one of you treasure our synagogue and badly want it to be here decades from now. Well, you have to do your part to make sure that happens.

I mentioned earlier that Saturday morning minyans were fairly well attended. However, Friday evening minyans attract 10 men rarely.

Rather, there are usually 8 or 9 present. That occasionally happens on Saturday mornings as well. In an effort to make sure we have a minyan on both days, I have prepared a Duty Roster and will be distributing it before Rosh Hashanah. I have included on the Roster only the names of those men who have agreed to attend Services occasionally, to help make a minyan (the names of congregants who almost always attend these minyans are not included on the Roster). When your turn comes, please attend Services, as we are depending on you.

Please make certain to follow ALL THE RULES prepared by our Covid Safety Committee, in order to protect everyone during the High Holy Days. Don't forget the following:

- 1. Everyone is required to use sanitizer before entering the sanctuary.
- 2. Always wear a mask
- 3. Keep social distances except for members of the same family.
- 4. Only members and Jews from out of town who have bought seats for the High Holidays can attend. In addition, these Jews from out of town are required to be fully vaccinated.
- 5. Have chairs in the lobby and in the Kiddush room for members who have to wait if all seats are taken because of social distancing.

One of the rules adopted by the Committee dealt with shortening the Services. Rabbi Yagod reviewed the Rosh Hashanah Services and the Rabbi summarized their agreement following:

I went over the Machzor with the Gabbai, Francis.
I told him we would keep the services to about 2 hours total due to Covid.
Start time 10:00am
Shofar approx. 11:00 am
End time approx. 12 noon
Only evening service is for Monday evening to usher in the New Year at 7 PM
Shacharit to be said at home
Services start just before TORAH reading and go straightforward until after Mussaf.

This was done previously and is best for Halachah!

At our last meeting, the Board decided that we should have security outside the synagogue while Services are taking place. I have hired a sheriff for this purpose.

As well, Board members will take turns standing at the entrance to the main sanctuary making sure that all Covid rules are being followed and that only members and out-of-towners who have purchased seats enter the sanctuary.

Just a word about the bills which went out recently. I know that you had increases in your annual dues. However, like I said in my e-mail a few weeks ago, we absolutely need more revenue to keep the shul going. Everyone has to pay their fair share. It is not a question of wanting to impose these increases but rather it's a necessity. DON'T FORGET: you are again able to pay your shul bill using either VISA or MASTERCARD.... or, you can use e-transfer, cash or cheque.

From the Lampert family, all good wishes to you and your family for a healthy, happy and prosperous new year.

belonging, Jewish fellowship, spiritual fulfillment and rich social life.

The next steps would include developing recommendations and an action plan that would hopefully allow our community to thrive for many years to come.
