Message from the Rabbi

Happy New Year • An 'Opening' Statement

Rosh Hashanah and the Jewish New Year of 5781 is almost upon us. I'd like to point out a few fascinating facts that aren't very well known yet carry a powerful message for the entire Jewish nation.

Rosh Hashanah is known as the Day of Judgment—the day that the Book of Life is opened in front of us. However, Rosh Hashanah is also the anniversary of the Creation of the world, and that in itself is a powerful message for all of us.

Here's another fascinating fact: The Talmud writes that teshuva (repentance) was created before the Creation of the world was complete. It was brought from the very beginning. This needs to be understood. You may ask how teshuva is a creation. Isn't it a choice that people make to either mend their ways or not? And why was teshuva needed so early on?

First, it should be noted that "repentance" is not a perfect translation for teshuva. I used it because it is the most wellknown translation. However. if you read the ancient writings of famous scholars, you will realize that a better translation for teshuva is "returning". Returning to our natural state. A person is naturally born good and can move away from that by making choices that aren't so good. So, teshuva is the opportunity to return to that first stage.

It has been written that teshuva is miraculous,

because if one really gets teshuva right, then the history, in a divine way, in a way only the Creator can do, is changed, and there is nothing left of the negative acts that the person performed. That is why when a person does teshuva, you are not allowed to remind them of their former mistakes, or errors of any type or sort.

Essentially, teshuva is probably the greatest gift that came with the Creation of the world, because it offers a person a fresh chance without them being burdened or chained down by past mistakes. Teshuva allows a person to be remade essentially as fresh as the day they were first born. This is so powerful that it had to be built into the very essential elements of the world we live in. The chance to always fix a mistake is a condition by which the world continues to exist. It is built into the very workings of the world. Without teshuva, there is nothing.

This is what Rosh Hashanah is about. This comes back to the fact that Rosh Hashanah is the anniversary of the world's Creation. Once there is a chance to do teshuva, which Rosh Hashanah is very much about, then there's an incredible world, because Creation (and recreation) is incredible. Therefore, Rosh Hashanah comes out on the anniversary of the Creation of the world, which is perfect timing.

Now, let us all understand that no one is perfect, we all have flaws. The Talmud says there is not a righteous person in this world who has never done any wrong. So let all enhance our lives in this world by embracing the divine present of teshuva wholeheartedly, towards both ourselves and each other, and forgive ourselves and each other. We can do it. We will most assuredly live longer and happier lives because of it. Let's make it a really delightful year. I look forward to seeing vou in Shul.
