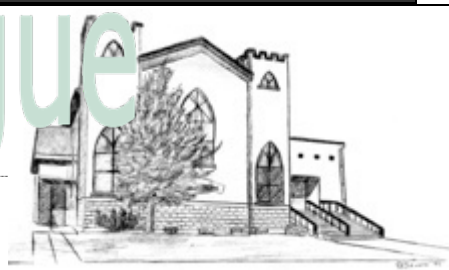

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Congregant,

Rosh Hashanah is fast approaching and I'm happy to bring you Shana Tova and Good Wishes from the Board of Directors. May 5786 be a good year for all. May we see the return of all the hostages and have Peace again through the world, may the hate and the hostility against Jews in general and Jewish students in particular subside.

We recently lost **Alan Hans**, z"l, at 98, our oldest member, a beautiful soul who went to be together with his wife of more than 70 years Betty. The two will be deeply missed.

On August 23, Shabbat Re'eh, **Benjamin Makarov** had his bar-mitzvah. Mazal tov to **Benjamin**, your family can be very proud of your Torah reading, of your Haftara reading and of your beautiful speech!

2026 is coming soon, that will be the 100th anniversary for the building. Let us keep this in mind and start to plan. Meanwhile, whether you are in Moncton or moved away, let us know if we can count on you

to help organize the celebrations.

Last Shabbat, in Shul, I was reflecting on the state of our community. True, we are small in number, but we have potential. We can be proud that we continue to have minyanim almost every single week. For that we must thank a nucleus of good people – all those who make a point to come regularly – especially those good souls who accept to prepare the reading of the Torah.

I know that, for some of you, religion is not the most important aspect of Jewish life, that the cultural aspect is more important.

It is good to know that slowly but surely something is coming into place. We are starting the nucleus of a cultural center. It will develop. Little by little we will introduce different kind of activities. We want to bring life in the building. Sports? Conferences? Discussions? Self-defense classes? Activities for children? Chess tournaments? Hebrew classes? Yiddish classes? Ping pong tournaments? Yoga classes? Cooking classes? Get involved. It will be for the good of Jewish life and culture in general.

Do not be shy, we need your input, whether you have been in the region for a long time or are a

newcomer. Please let us know your ideas for various activities that should be organized.

Members have received a letter from the synagogue about the dues for the coming year. A copy of it has been included in this bulletin, page 6. **To those who did not receive the message, please know that the Synagogue had to pay for many repairs this year: roof, chimneys, wall, security system, etc. The expenses were over 30 000\$. **Report to Shalom Magazine** (this report was written in July 2025)

Six months ago, in the last issue of Shalom Magazine, I tried something new. Curious to see whether people read the reports I have been writing

about Jewish life in Moncton the past few years, I asked people to let me know if they read my report or not.

Thank you, Harvey and Martin, it was very nice to hear from both of you. Wondering, though, did anyone else read the report? Maybe not, maybe the number of people interested in Jewish life in Moncton is very small.

Another thought to share with you: there are some who realize the importance to have a structure supporting Jewish life in our hometown. But some do not. In Moncton many families are interested to continue Jewish traditions and celebrate Lag Ba'Omer, Purim and Hanukkah but are not prepared to contribute financially on a regular basis to support a synagogue and a Jewish cemetery. Judaism cannot survive if we don't have an organisation where religion and regular weekly services are included.

On March 13, R. Pinchas Yagod came for **Purim** and did two readings of the Megillah. As always, both his readings were outstanding, the children and some of the parents wore costumes. The Israeli group of volunteers who are branching out as a "Moncton Jewish Community Centre" (MJCC), organised a party for adults on Saturday at Dooly's.

Later in March, our congregation had its **AGM**. A new board was elected, some members are new, some others are continuing for another year. [David Rinzler](#)

stepped down; David had been member of the board for many years. He was the one who was looking after the building and its repairs. A special Kiddush was organized to express our gratitude to David. It happened on May 3<sup>rd</sup> and was very well attended.

The **Sisterhood** branch of the community had a meeting on April 2 to explore the ways the organisation could modernize and reinvent itself. Right now, Shayna, Avigail, Carole and Victoria are doing most of the work preparing the kiddushes, but it is nice to see that new people like Miri, Yana and Debbie start to get involved.

On April 23 the Moncton Jewish community has its annual ceremony for **Yom HaShoah**. This year the guest speaker was [Ivana Fogarty](#), a third-generation Holocaust survivor, as she shared her grandparents' powerful survival story. Drawing from her translation of "**The Loves I Have Lost**" by **Alica Fruhwaldova**, Ivana honoured the memories of those who endured unimaginable hardships and celebrated the resilience and love that sustained them. Her presentation was a tribute to the enduring spirit of Holocaust survivors and the importance of remembrance and education.

Thank you to the organizers, to Victoria, Zohar, Jack, Deborah, Christine, Theodore, Carole, Alexander, Benjamin, Michael, Shlomo, Timothy and his 2 helpers, Michal & Campbell and the kids who lit the candles, Oren, Alon, Chloe, Bella, Benjamin, Itay, Eitan and Daniel. This summer, repairs will continue to be done to the building. We will use a 10,000\$ grant from Heritage Moncton to cover 50% of the expenses. Once again, we will gratefully use the help of Timothy Davis and his

good abilities to perform the work.

We have chosen not to augment them. However, please note that donations made on top of yearly dues play a central role in the Shul attaining financial solvency.

If you can afford to make an extra donation, it will be greatly appreciated. Many members were very generous in past years; we are very grateful to them and the role they play in the community.

The building will be 100 years old next year and we continue the repairs that were started a year and a half ago. We are fortunate to have Timothy Davis working on the foundations and on the chimney. The City of Moncton intends to recognize the quality of his work at a ceremony later this year.

Although we have, again this year, received a 10 000 \$ grant to cover the repairs, it only covers 50% of the expenses. Insurance and electricity continue to be heavy on our expenses (close to 50000 \$).

If you can help us in our mission to keep the building in a good shape, it will be much appreciated.

The board of directors has named Lee Wilson to chair the activities to commemorate our 100th anniversary. Thank you, Lee, for accepting.
